

GRADUATE FUNDING AVAILABLE IN 2021-22

The School of Music is seeking qualified graduate students to fill the following positions. Appointments are generally awarded to incoming students on the basis of the student's general application to the graduate program of the School of Music. However, currently enrolled students are also eligible for most of these appointments. All appointments come with tuition remission, a monthly stipend, and health insurance.

There is no separate application for funding. In order to be eligible for these appointments, your graduate application must be complete by **Tuesday, December 1, 2020**. Currently enrolled students should consult James Doing, Jr., in the Graduate Office for availability. Offers will be made throughout the months of March and April.
